Transport yourself back to 1524, when King Henry VIII was still married to Catherine of Aragon. During this year a significant event unfolded in Chepstow, the Earl of Worcester bestowed upon the town's inhabitants a charter with which to govern the town, along with the iconic town arch.

This charter vested power in four elected merchants and guild members, termed burgesses, granting them the authority

to administer the town's affairs. Their duties ranged from tax collection at local markets to maintaining law and order, even using the Town Gate as a jail.

Some individuals had circumvented the town's tolls by establishing an informal market outside the gate in Moor Street.
